# U.S. Air Force Fact Sheet 28th Bomb Wing

#### Overview

The 28th Bomb Wing, activated July 28, 1947, is an Air Force wing located at Ellsworth Air Force Base, South Dakota, and is one of two bases responsible for the operation and maintenance of the B-1B Lancer. The wing is aligned under Air Force Global Strike Command.

The 28th Bomb wing is home to 3,700 Airmen and operates 27 B-1B Lancers.

The base also hosts the 89th Attack Squadron, assigned to the 432nd Wing, which operates the MQ-9 Reaper.

# History

March 21, 1946 – Rapid City Army Air Base redesignated under Strategic Air Command

July 28, 1947 – Established as 28th Bombardment Wing at Rapid City Army Air Field

Dec. 1, 1960 – 850th Strategic Missile Wing established to system Titan I missiles

1962 – 66th, 67th, and 68th Strategic Missile Squadrons to support Minuteman I system

Jan. 1 1987 - B-1B Lancers arrive at Ellsworth AFB

Jan. 1, 1987 – 37th Bomb Squadron activated at 28th Bombardment Wing

Dec. 20, 1989 – 28th Bombardment Wing provide tanker support for Operation Just Cause

July 31, 1990 – Realigned under Strategic Warfare Center

Sept. 1, 1991 – Redesignated as 28th Wing

June 1, 1992 – Realigned under Air Combat Command

June 1, 1992 – Redesignated as 28th Bomb Wing

April 1, 1997 – 77th Bomb Squadron activated at 28th Bomb Wing

April 1, 1999 – 77th Bomb Squadron B-1B Lancers participate in Operation Allied Force

Sept. 19, 2001 – 34th Bomb Squadron assigned to 28th Bomb Wing

March 27, 2011 – 34th Bomb Squadron deployed in support of Operation Odyssey Dawn

Oct. 1, 2015 – Realigned under Air Force Global Strike Command

Oct. 1, 2015 – Reassigned to Eighth Air Force

July 2016 – 34th Bomb Squadron deployed in support of Continuous Bomber Presence

July 2017 – January 2018 – 37th Bomb Squadron deployed in support of CBP

March 2018 – 34th Bomb Squadron deployed in support of Operation Inherent Resolve

## Wing Emblem

Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The emblem reflects the Wing's predecessor World War II unit, the 28th Bombardment Wing. The nebula partition line symbolizes clouds and denotes the Wing's area of operation within the Air Force global reach mission.
